- 1817 Crossing of the Andes: Many soldiers of <u>Juan Gregorio de las Heras</u> are captured during the Action of Picheuta.
- <u>1835</u> Slaves in <u>Salvador da Bahia</u>, Brazil, <u>stage a revolt</u>, which is instrumental in ending slavery there 50 years later.
- <u>1848</u> <u>California Gold Rush</u>: <u>James W. Marshall</u> finds <u>gold</u> at <u>Sutter's Mill</u> near Sacramento.
- 1859 Political and state union of Moldavia and Wallachia; Alexandru Ioan Cuza is elected as Domnitor in both Principalities.
- <u>1862</u> <u>Bucharest</u> is proclaimed capital of <u>Romania</u>.
- <u>1900</u> <u>Second Boer War</u>: <u>Boers</u> stop a British attempt to break the <u>Siege of Ladysmith</u> in the <u>Battle of Spion Kop</u>.
- 1908 The first <u>Boy Scout</u> troop is organized in <u>England</u> by <u>Robert Baden-</u> Powell.
- 1911 Japanese anarchist <u>Shūsui Kōtoku</u> is hanged for treason in a case now considered a miscarriage of justice.
- <u>1916</u> In <u>Brushaber v. Union Pacific Railroad</u>, the <u>Supreme Court of the United</u> States declares the federal income tax constitutional.
- 1933 The 20th Amendment to the United States Constitution is ratified, changing the beginning and end of terms for all elected federal offices.
- <u>1942 World War II</u>: The <u>Allies</u> bombard <u>Bangkok</u>, leading <u>Thailand</u>, then under Japanese control, to declare war against the <u>United States</u> and <u>United Kingdom</u>.
- 1943 World War II: Franklin D. Roosevelt and Winston Churchill conclude a conference in Casablanca.
- 1946 The <u>United Nations General Assembly</u> passes its first resolution to establish the <u>United Nations Atomic Energy Commission</u>.
- 1947 Greek banker Dimitrios Maximos becomes Prime Minister of Greece.
- 1960 Algerian War: Some units of European volunteers in Algiers stage an insurrection known as the "barricades week", during which they seize government buildings and clash with local police.

- 1961 1961 Goldsboro B-52 crash: A bomber carrying two H-bombs breaks up in mid-air over North Carolina. The uranium core of one weapon remains lost.
- 1972 <u>Japanese</u> Sgt. <u>Shoichi Yokoi</u> is found hiding in a <u>Guam</u> jungle, where he had been since the end of World War II.
- 1977 Massacre of Atocha in Madrid, during the Spanish transition to democracy.
- 1978 Soviet satellite Cosmos 954, with a nuclear reactor on board, burns up in Earth's atmosphere, scattering radioactive debris over Canada's Northwest Territories. Only 1% is recovered.
- 1984 The first <u>Apple Macintosh</u> goes on sale.
- 1986 Voyager 2 passes within 81,500 kilometres (50,600 mi) of Uranus.
- 1990 Japan launches <u>Hiten</u>, the country's first <u>lunar probe</u>, the first robotic lunar probe since the <u>Soviet Union</u>'s <u>Luna 24</u> in 1976, and the first lunar probe launched by a country other than Soviet Union or the <u>United States</u>.
- 1993 <u>Turkish</u> journalist and writer <u>Uğur Mumcu</u> is assassinated by a <u>car bomb</u> in Ankara.
- 1996 Polish Prime Minister Józef Oleksy resigns amid charges that he spied for Moscow.
- 2003 The <u>United States Department of Homeland Security</u> officially begins operation.
- 2009 The storm <u>Klaus</u> makes landfall near <u>Bordeaux</u>, <u>France</u>. It subsequently would cause 26 deaths as well as extensive disruptions to public transport and power supplies.
- 2011 At least 35 died and 180 injured in a <u>bombing</u> at Moscow's <u>Domodedovo</u> <u>airport</u>.
