- 1687 Explorer Robert Cavelier de La Salle, searching for the mouth of the Mississippi River, is murdered by his own men.
- 1861 The First Taranaki War ends in New Zealand.

- 1863 The <u>SS Georgiana</u>, said to have been the most powerful <u>Confederate cruiser</u>, is destroyed on her <u>maiden voyage</u> with a cargo of munitions, medicines and merchandise then valued at over \$1,000,000.
- 1865 American Civil War: The <u>Battle of Bentonville</u> begins. By the end of the battle two days later, Confederate forces had retreated from <u>Four Oaks, North Carolina</u>.
- 1885 Louis Riel declares a <u>Provisional Government</u> in <u>Saskatchewan</u>, beginning the <u>North-West Rebellion</u>.
- 1895 <u>Auguste and Louis Lumière</u> record their first footage using their newly patented cinematograph.
- <u>1918</u> The <u>U.S. Congress</u> establishes <u>time zones</u> and approves <u>daylight saving</u> time.
- <u>1920</u> The <u>United States Senate</u> rejects the <u>Treaty of Versailles</u> for the second time (the first time was on November 19, 1919).
- <u>1921</u> <u>Irish War of Independence</u>: One of <u>the biggest engagements</u> of the war takes place at <u>Crossbarry</u>, <u>County Cork</u>. About 100 <u>Irish Republican Army</u> (IRA) volunteers escape an attempt by over 1,300 British forces to encircle them.
- 1921 <u>Italian Fascists</u> shoot from the <u>Parenzana train</u> at a group of children in <u>Strunjan</u> (<u>Slovenia</u>): two children are killed and five wounded.
- 1931 Gambling is legalized in Nevada.
- <u>1941</u> <u>World War II</u>: The 99th Pursuit Squadron also known as the <u>Tuskegee</u> Airmen, the first all-black unit of the Army Air Corp, is activated.
- 1943 Frank Nitti, the Chicago Outfit Boss after Al Capone, commits suicide at the Chicago Central Railyard.
- <u>1944</u> World War II: <u>Nazi</u> forces occupy <u>Hungary</u>.
- 1945 World War II: Off the coast of <u>Japan</u>, a <u>dive bomber</u> hits the <u>aircraft</u> <u>carrier USS Franklin</u>, killing 724 of her crew. Badly damaged, the ship is able to return to the U.S. under her own power.
- 1945 World War II: <u>Adolf Hitler</u> issues his "<u>Nero Decree</u>" ordering all industries, military installations, shops, transportation facilities and communications facilities in <u>Germany</u> to be destroyed.
- <u>1946 French Guiana, Guadeloupe, Martinique</u> and <u>Réunion</u> become <u>overseas</u> <u>départements</u> of France.
- 1954 Joey Giardello knocks out Willie Tory in round seven at Madison Square
 Garden in the first televised prize boxing fight shown in colour.
- 1954 Willie Mosconi sets a world record by running 526 consecutive balls without a miss during a straight pool exhibition at East High Billiard Club in Springfield, Ohio. The record still stands today.
- 1958 The Monarch Underwear Company fire leaves 24 dead and 15 injured.
- <u>1962</u> Highly influential artist, <u>Bob Dylan</u> releases his first album, <u>Bob Dylan</u>, on <u>Columbia Records</u> label.
- 1965 The wreck of the <u>SS Georgiana</u>, valued at over \$50,000,000 and said to have been the most powerful <u>Confederate cruiser</u>, is discovered by teenage diver and pioneer <u>underwater archaeologist</u> <u>E. Lee Spence</u>, exactly 102 years after its destruction.
- <u>1966</u> <u>Texas Western</u> becomes the first college <u>basketball</u> team to win the <u>Final</u> <u>Four</u> with an all-<u>black</u> starting lineup.
- 1979 The <u>United States House of Representatives</u> begins broadcasting its dayto-day business via the cable television network <u>C-SPAN</u>.

- 1982 <u>Falklands War</u>: <u>Argentinian</u> forces land on <u>South Georgia</u> Island, precipitating war with the <u>United Kingdom</u>.
- 1987 Televangelist <u>Jim Bakker</u> resigns as head of the <u>PTL Club</u> due to a brewing sex scandal; he hands over control to <u>Jerry Falwell</u>.
- 1989 The Egyptian Flag is raised on Taba, Egypt announcing the end of the Israeli occupation after the Yom Kippur War in 1973 and the peace negotiations in 1979.
- <u>1990</u> The <u>ethnic clashes of Târgu Mureş</u> begin four days after the anniversary of the Revolutions of 1848 in the Habsburg areas.
- 2002 Zimbabwe is <u>suspended</u> from the <u>Commonwealth</u> on charges of <u>human</u> <u>rights</u> abuses and of <u>electoral fraud</u>, following a turbulent presidential election.
- <u>2004 Konginkangas bus disaster</u>: A <u>semi-trailer truck</u> and a bus crash head-on in <u>Äänekoski</u>, <u>Finland</u>. 24 people are killed and 13 injured.
- 2004 A Swedish <u>DC-3</u> shot down by a Russian <u>MiG-15</u> in 1952 over the <u>Baltic Sea</u> is finally recovered after years of work. The remains of the three crewmen are left in place, pending further investigations.
- 2004 <u>3-19 Shooting Incident</u>: <u>Taiwanese</u> president <u>Chen Shui-bian</u> is shot just before the country's presidential election on <u>March 20</u>.
- 2008 GRB 080319B: A cosmic burst that is the farthest object visible to the naked eye is briefly observed.
- 2011 <u>Libyan civil war</u>: After the failure of <u>Muammar Gaddafi</u>'s forces <u>to take</u> <u>Benghazi</u>, <u>French Air Force</u> launches <u>Opération Harmattan</u>, beginning <u>foreign</u> <u>military intervention in Libya</u>.
