- <u>1775</u> The <u>American Revolutionary War</u>'s first naval engagement, the <u>Battle of</u> <u>Machias</u>, results in the capture of a small British naval vessel.
- <u>1776</u> The <u>Continental Congress</u> appoints <u>Thomas Jefferson</u>, <u>John Adams</u>, <u>Benjamin Franklin</u>, <u>Roger Sherman</u>, and <u>Robert R. Livingston</u> to the <u>Committee</u> <u>of Five</u> to draft a <u>declaration of independence</u>.
- <u>1788 Russian</u> explorer <u>Gerasim Izmailov</u> reaches <u>Alaska</u>.
- <u>1825</u> The first <u>cornerstone</u> is laid for <u>Fort Hamilton</u> in <u>New York City</u>.

- <u>1917</u> King <u>Alexander</u> assumes the throne of <u>Greece</u> after his father <u>Constantine I</u> abdicates under pressure by <u>allied</u> armies occupying <u>Athens</u>.
- <u>1919 Sir Barton</u> wins the <u>Belmont Stakes</u>, becoming the first horse to win the <u>Triple Crown</u>.
- <u>1920</u> During the <u>U.S. Republican National Convention</u> in <u>Chicago</u>, <u>U.S.</u> <u>Republican Party</u> leaders gathered in a room at the <u>Blackstone Hotel</u> to come to a consensus on their candidate for the <u>U.S. presidential election</u>, leading the <u>Associated Press</u> to first coin the political phrase "<u>smoke-filled room</u>".
- <u>1935</u> Inventor <u>Edwin Armstrong</u> gives the first public demonstration of <u>FM</u> broadcasting in the United States at <u>Alpine</u>, <u>New Jersey</u>.
- <u>1937</u> <u>Great Purge</u>: The <u>Soviet Union</u> under <u>Joseph Stalin</u> executes <u>eight army</u> <u>leaders</u>.

- <u>1938</u> <u>Second Sino-Japanese War</u>: The <u>Battle of Wuhan</u> starts.
- 1938 Second Sino-Japanese War: The Chinese Nationalist government creates the <u>1938 Yellow River flood</u> to halt <u>Japanese</u> forces. 500,000 to 900,000 civilians are killed.
- <u>1942</u> World War II: The United States agrees to send <u>Lend-Lease</u> aid to the Soviet Union.
- <u>1944</u> <u>USS Missouri (BB-63)</u> the last <u>battleship</u> built by the <u>United States Navy</u> and future site of the signing of the <u>Japanese Instrument of Surrender</u>, is <u>commissioned</u>.
- <u>1955</u> Eighty-three are killed and at least 100 are injured after an <u>Austin-Healey</u> and a <u>Mercedes-Benz collide at the 24 Hours of Le Mans</u>, the deadliest ever accident in <u>motorsports</u>.
- <u>1956</u> Start of <u>Gal Oya riots</u>, the first reported ethnic riots that target minority <u>Sri</u> <u>Lankan Tamils</u> in the Eastern Province. The total number of deaths is reportedly 150.
- <u>1962</u> <u>Frank Morris</u>, <u>John Anglin</u> and <u>Clarence Anglin</u> allegedly become the only prisoners to <u>escape</u> from the prison on <u>Alcatraz Island</u>.
- <u>1963</u> <u>American Civil Rights Movement</u>: <u>Alabama Governor George Wallace</u> <u>stands at the door</u> of <u>Foster Auditorium</u> at the <u>University of Alabama</u> in an attempt to block two black students, <u>Vivian Malone</u> and <u>James Hood</u>, from attending that school. Later in the day, accompanied by federalized <u>National</u> <u>Guard</u> troops, they are able to register.
- 1963 <u>Buddhist</u> monk <u>Thich Quang Duc burns himself</u> with <u>gasoline</u> in a busy <u>Saigon</u> intersection to protest the lack of religious freedom in <u>South Vietnam</u>.
- 1963 John F. Kennedy addresses Americans from the Oval Office proposing the <u>Civil Rights Act of 1964</u> that would revolutionize American society. Proposing equal access to public facilities, end segregation in education and guarantee federal protection for voting rights.
- <u>1964</u> World War II veteran <u>Walter Seifert</u> runs amok in an elementary school in <u>Cologne</u>, <u>Germany</u>, killing at least eight children and two teachers and seriously injuring several more with a home-made <u>flamethrower</u> and a <u>lance</u>.
- <u>1970</u> After being appointed on <u>May 15</u>, <u>Anna Mae Hays</u> and <u>Elizabeth P.</u> <u>Hoisington</u> officially receive their ranks as <u>U.S. Army Generals</u>, becoming the first females to do so.
- <u>1971</u> The <u>U.S. Government</u> forcibly removes the last holdouts to the <u>Native</u> <u>American Occupation of Alcatraz</u>, ending 19 months of control.
- <u>1998</u> <u>Compaq</u> Computer pays <u>\$9</u> billion for <u>Digital Equipment Corporation</u> in the largest high-tech acquisition.
- <u>2001</u> <u>Timothy McVeigh</u> is executed for his role in the <u>Oklahoma City bombing</u>.
- <u>2002</u> <u>Antonio Meucci</u> is acknowledged as the first inventor of the <u>telephone</u> by the <u>United States Congress</u>.
- <u>2008</u> <u>Canadian Prime Minister Stephen Harper</u> makes a historic official apology to Canada's <u>First Nations</u> in regard to a <u>residential school abuse</u> in which children are isolated from their homes, families and cultures for a century.
- <u>2012</u> <u>Two earthquakes</u> struck northern <u>Afghanistan</u>, causing a large <u>landslide</u>, which buried the town of Sayi Hazara, trapping 71 people. After four days of digging, only five bodies were recovered and the search was called off.
