- 1621 The <u>Mayflower</u> sets sail from <u>Plymouth</u>, <u>Massachusetts</u> on a return trip to <u>England</u>.
- <u>1792</u> <u>U.S. President George Washington</u> exercises his authority to <u>veto</u> a bill, the first time this power is used in the <u>United States</u>.

- 1942 World War II: The <u>Imperial Japanese Navy launches a carrier-based air attack on Colombo</u>, <u>Ceylon</u> during the <u>Indian Ocean Raid</u>. Port and civilian facilities are damaged and the <u>Royal Navy cruisers</u> <u>HMS Cornwall</u> and <u>HMS Dorsetshire</u> are sunk southwest of the island.
- 1943 World War II: American bomber aircraft accidentally cause more than 900 civilian deaths, including 209 children, and 1300 wounded among the civilian population of the <u>Belgian</u> town of <u>Mortsel</u>. The target is the Erla factory one kilometer from the residential area hit.
- <u>1944</u> World War II: 270 inhabitants of the Greek town of <u>Kleisoura</u> are executed by the <u>Germans</u>.
- <u>1945</u> <u>Cold War</u>: <u>Yugoslav</u> leader <u>Josip "Tito" Broz</u> signs an agreement with the <u>Soviet Union</u> to allow "temporary entry of Soviet troops into Yugoslav territory".
- <u>1946</u> Soviet troops leave the island of <u>Bornholm</u>, <u>Denmark</u> after an 11 month occupation.
- 1949 Fireside Theater debuts on television.
- 1949 A fire in a hospital in <u>Effingham, Illinois</u>, kills 77 people and leads to nationwide fire code improvements in the <u>United States</u>.
- <u>1951</u> <u>Ethel and Julius Rosenberg</u> are sentenced to death for performing espionage for the Soviet Union.
- 1956 Fidel Castro declares himself at war with the President of Cuba.
- 1956 In <u>Sri Lanka</u>, the <u>Mahajana Eksath Peramuna</u> win the <u>general elections</u> in a landslide and S.W.R.D. Bandaranaike is sworn in as the Prime Minister.
- <u>1957</u> In <u>India</u>, <u>Communists</u> win the first elections in united <u>Kerala</u> and <u>E.M.S.</u> Namboodiripad is sworn in as the first chief minister.
- 1958 Ripple Rock, an underwater threat to navigation in the Seymour Narrows in Canada is destroyed in one of the largest non-nuclear controlled explosions of the time.
- 1969 Vietnam War: Massive antiwar demonstrations occur in many U.S. cities.
- 1971 In Sri Lanka, <u>Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna</u> launches insurrection against the <u>United Front</u> government of <u>Sirimavo Bandaranaike</u>.
- <u>1976</u> In the <u>People's Republic of China</u>, the <u>April Fifth Movement</u> leads to the Tiananmen incident.
- 1986 Three people are killed in the <u>bombing</u> of the <u>La Belle Discothèque</u> in <u>West Berlin, Germany</u>.
- <u>1992</u> <u>Alberto Fujimori</u>, president of Peru, <u>dissolves the Peruvian congress</u> by military force.
- 1992 The <u>Siege of Sarajevo</u> begins when <u>Serb paramilitaries</u> murder peace protesters <u>Suada Dilberovic</u> and <u>Olga Sučić</u> on the Vrbanja Bridge.
- 1998 In <u>Japan</u>, the <u>Akashi-Kaikyo Bridge</u> linking <u>Awaji Island</u> with <u>Honshū</u> and costing about \$3.8 billion <u>USD</u>, opens to traffic, becoming the largest <u>suspension bridge</u> in the world.
- 1999 Two <u>Libyans</u> suspected of bringing down <u>Pan Am flight 103</u> in <u>1988</u> are handed over for eventual trial in the Netherlands.

- <u>2009</u> <u>North Korea</u> launches its controversial <u>Kwangmyŏngsŏng-2</u> rocket. The satellite passed over mainland <u>Japan</u>, which prompted an immediate reaction from the <u>United Nations Security Council</u>, as well as participating states of <u>Six-party talks</u>.
- <u>2010</u> Twenty-nine coal miners are killed in an explosion at the <u>Upper Big Branch Mine</u> in <u>West Virginia</u>.
