- <u>1701</u> After being convicted of <u>piracy</u> and of murdering William Moore, Captain <u>William Kidd</u> is hanged in <u>London</u>.
- 1706 <u>Battle of Ramillies</u>: <u>John Churchill, 1st Duke of Marlborough</u>, defeats a <u>French</u> army under <u>Marshal Villeroi</u>.
- 1788 South Carolina ratifies the Constitution as the 8th American state.
- <u>1793</u> <u>Battle of Famars</u> during the <u>Flanders Campaign</u> of the <u>War of the First</u> Coalition.
- <u>1813</u> <u>South American independence</u> leader <u>Simón Bolívar</u> enters <u>Mérida</u>, leading the invasion of <u>Venezuela</u>, and is proclaimed *El Libertador* ("The Liberator").
- <u>1846</u> <u>Mexican-American War</u>: President <u>Mariano Paredes</u> of <u>Mexico</u> unofficially declares war on the United States.
- 1873 The <u>Canadian</u> Parliament establishes the <u>North-West Mounted Police</u>, the forerunner of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.
- <u>1900</u> <u>American Civil War</u>: Sergeant <u>William Harvey Carney</u> is awarded the Medal of Honor, for his heroism in the Assault on the Battery Wagner in 1863.
- <u>1915</u> <u>World War I</u>: Italy joins the <u>Allies</u> after they declare war on <u>Austria-</u> Hungary.
- 1932 In Brazil, four students are shot and killed during a manifestation against the Brazilian ditactor Getúlio Vargas, which occurred in the city of <u>São Paulo</u>. Their names/surnames were used to form the M.M.D.C., a revolutionary group that would act against the dictatorial governament, especially in the <u>Constitutionalist Revolution</u> ("Revolução Constitucionalista", in Portuguese), the major uprising in Brazil during the 20th century.
- <u>1934</u> American <u>bank robbers</u> <u>Bonnie and Clyde</u> are ambushed by police and killed in <u>Black Lake</u>, <u>Louisiana</u>.

- 1934 The <u>Auto-Lite Strike</u> culminates in the "Battle of Toledo", a five-day melée between 1,300 troops of the <u>Ohio National Guard</u> and 6,000 picketers.
- 1939 The U.S. Navy <u>submarine USS Squalus</u> sinks off the coast of <u>New Hampshire</u> during a test dive, causing the death of 24 sailors and two civilian technicians. The remaining 32 sailors and one civilian naval architect are rescued the following day.
- 1945 World War II: Heinrich Himmler, the head of the SS, commits suicide while in Allied custody.
- 1945 World War II: The <u>Flensburg government</u> under <u>Reichspräsident Karl</u>
 <u>Dönitz</u> is dissolved when its members are captured and arrested by <u>British</u> forces at <u>Flensburg</u> in Northern <u>Germany</u>.
- 1948 Thomas C. Wasson, US Consul-General assassinated in Jerusalem.
- <u>1949</u> The <u>Federal Republic of Germany</u> is established and the <u>Basic Law for</u> the <u>Federal Republic of Germany</u> is proclaimed.
- 1951 <u>Tibetans</u> sign the <u>Seventeen Point Agreement for the Peaceful Liberation of Tibet with the People's Republic of China</u>.
- 1967 Egypt closes the Straits of Tiran and blockades the port of Eilat at the northern end of the Gulf of Aqaba to Israeli shipping.
- 1992 Italy's most prominent anti-mafia judge <u>Giovanni Falcone</u>, his wife and three body guards are killed by the <u>Corleonesi</u> clan with a half-ton bomb near <u>Capaci</u>, <u>Sicily</u>. His friend and colleague <u>Paolo Borsellino</u> will be assassinated less than 2 months later, making 1992 a turning point in the history of <u>Italian Mafia</u> prosecutions.
- 1995 The first version of the Java programming language is released.
- 1998 The Good Friday Agreement is accepted in a referendum in Northern Ireland with 75% voting yes.
- 2004 Part of <u>Paris-Charles de Gaulle Airport</u>'s Terminal 2E collapses, killing four people and injuring three others.
- <u>2006</u> <u>Alaskan stratovolcano Mount Cleveland</u> erupts.
- 2008 The <u>International Court of Justice</u> (ICJ) awards <u>Middle Rocks</u> to <u>Malaysia</u> and <u>Pedra Branca</u> (<u>Pulau Batu Puteh</u>) to <u>Singapore</u>, ending a 29-year <u>territorial</u> dispute between the two countries.
- 2010 <u>Jamaican</u> police begin a manhunt for drug lord <u>Christopher "Dudus"</u>
