- <u>1588</u> The <u>Spanish Armada</u>, with 130 ships and 30,000 men, sets sail from <u>Lisbon</u> heading for the <u>English Channel</u>. (It will take until May 30 for all ships to leave port).
- 1644 <u>Bolton Massacre</u> by <u>Royalist</u> troops under the command of the <u>Earl of Derby</u>.
- <u>1754</u> <u>French and Indian War</u>: in the first engagement of the war, <u>Virginia militia</u> under 22-year-old <u>Lieutenant Colonel George Washington</u> defeat a <u>French</u> reconnaissance party in the <u>Battle of Jumonville Glen</u> in what is now <u>Fayette County</u> in southwestern <u>Pennsylvania</u>.
- <u>1830</u> President <u>Andrew Jackson</u> signs the <u>Indian Removal Act</u> which relocates Native Americans.
- 1892 In San Francisco, California, John Muir organizes the Sierra Club.
- 1905 Russo-Japanese War: The <u>Battle of Tsushima</u> ends with the destruction of the <u>Russian Baltic Fleet</u> by <u>Admiral Togo Heihachiro</u> and the <u>Imperial</u> Japanese Navy.

- 1926 28th May 1926 coup d'état: <u>Ditadura Nacional</u> is established in <u>Portugal</u> to suppress the unrest of the <u>First Republic</u>.
- <u>1932</u> In the <u>Netherlands</u>, construction of the <u>Afsluitdijk</u> is completed and the <u>Zuiderzee</u> bay is <u>converted</u> to the freshwater <u>IJsselmeer</u>.
- <u>1934</u> Near <u>Callander, Ontario</u>, the <u>Dionne quintuplets</u> are born to Oliva and Elzire Dionne; they will be the first <u>quintuplets</u> to survive <u>infancy</u>.
- 1937 The Golden Gate Bridge in San Francisco, California, is officially opened by President Franklin D. Roosevelt in Washington, D.C., who pushes a button signaling the start of vehicle traffic over the span.
- 1937 Volkswagen (VW), German automobile manufacturer was founded
- 1940 World War II: Belgium surrenders to Germany to end the Battle of Belgium.
- 1940 World War II: <u>Norwegian</u>, <u>French</u>, <u>Polish</u> and <u>British</u> forces <u>recapture</u> <u>Narvik</u> in Norway. This is the first allied infantry victory of the War.
- 1942 World War II: in retaliation for the <u>assassination</u> of <u>Reinhard Heydrich</u>, <u>Nazis</u> in <u>Czechoslovakia</u> kill over 1,800 people.
- 1951 British radio comedy programme <u>The Goon Show</u> was broadcast on BBC for the first time.

- <u>1958</u> <u>Cuban Revolution</u>: <u>Fidel Castro</u>'s <u>26 July movement</u>, heavily reinforced by Frank Pais Militia, overwhelm an army post in El Uvero.
- 1961 Peter Benenson's article The Forgotten Prisoners is published in several internationally read newspapers. This will later be thought of as the founding of the human rights organization Amnesty International.
- 1964 The Palestine Liberation Organization is formed.
- <u>1974</u> <u>Northern Ireland</u>'s power-sharing <u>Sunningdale Agreement</u> collapses following a general strike by loyalists.
- <u>1975</u> Fifteen <u>West African</u> countries sign the <u>Treaty of Lagos</u>, creating the Economic Community of West African States.

Pakistan celebrates <u>Youm-e-Takbir</u> annually.
