- 1866 In the <u>Fenian Invasion of Canada</u>, John O'Neill leads 850 <u>Fenian</u> raiders across the <u>Niagara River</u> at <u>Buffalo</u>, <u>New York/Fort Erie</u>, <u>Ontario</u>, as part of an effort to free <u>Ireland</u> from the <u>United Kingdom</u>. <u>Canadian militia</u> and <u>British</u> regulars repulse the invaders in over the next three days, at a cost of 9 dead and 38 wounded to the <u>Fenian</u>'s 19 dead and about 17 wounded.
- 1879 Gilmores Garden in New York City is renamed Madison Square Garden by William Henry Vanderbilt and is opened to the public at 26th Street and Madison Avenue.
- 1884 The arrival at <u>Plymouth</u> of <u>Tawhiao</u>, King of <u>Maoris</u>, to claim protection of <u>Queen Victoria</u>
- <u>1889</u> <u>Johnstown Flood</u>: Over 2,200 people die after a dam break sends a 60foot (18-meter) wall of water over the town of <u>Johnstown</u>, <u>Pennsylvania</u>.
- <u>1902</u> <u>Second Boer War</u>: The <u>Treaty of Vereeniging</u> ends the war and ensures <u>British</u> control of <u>South Africa</u>.

- 1929 The first talking cartoon of Mickey Mouse, "The Karnival Kid", is released.
- 1935 A 7.7 <u>Mw earthquake</u> destroys <u>Quetta</u> in modern-day <u>Pakistan</u>: 40,000 dead.
- 1941 A <u>Luftwaffe</u> air raid in <u>Dublin</u>, <u>Ireland</u>, claims 38 lives.
