27. Today in History:

- <u>1781</u> <u>Jack Jouett</u> begins his midnight ride to warn <u>Thomas Jefferson</u> and the Virginia legislature of an impending raid by <u>Banastre Tarleton</u>.
- 1839 In <u>Humen</u>, <u>China</u>, <u>Lin Tse-hsü</u> destroys 1.2 million kg of opium confiscated from British merchants, providing Britain with a *casus belli* to open hostilities, resulting in the <u>First Opium War</u>.
- <u>1861</u> <u>American Civil War</u>: <u>Battle of Philippi</u> (also called the Philippi Races) <u>Union</u> forces rout <u>Confederate</u> troops in <u>Barbour County, Virginia</u>, now <u>West Virginia</u>, in first land battle of the War.
- 1862 A 3000-strong riot occurred at <u>Wardsend Cemetery</u> in the <u>Sheffield</u>, <u>England</u>, against rumours of bodysnatching from the grounds.
- <u>1864</u> American Civil War: <u>Battle of Cold Harbor</u> Union forces attack Confederate troops in Hanover County, Virginia.
- 1866 The Fenians are driven out of Fort Erie, Ontario, into the United States.
- 1885 In the last military engagement fought on Canadian soil, the <u>Cree</u> leader, <u>Big Bear</u>, escapes the <u>North-West Mounted Police</u>.
- <u>1888</u> The <u>poem</u> "<u>Casey at the Bat</u>", by <u>Ernest Lawrence Thayer</u>, is published in the <u>San Francisco Examiner</u>.
- 1889 The first long-distance <u>electric power transmission</u> line in the United States is completed, running 14 miles (23 km) between a generator at <u>Willamette Falls</u> and downtown <u>Portland</u>, <u>Oregon</u>.
- 1916 The <u>National Defense Act</u> is signed into law, increasing the size of the <u>United States National Guard</u> by 450,000 men.
- 1932 Lou Gehrig and his teammate Tony Lazzeri hit four home runs in one game, and hit for the <u>natural cycle</u>, respectively. These two feats are both less common than a <u>perfect game</u>, which has occurred twenty-one times in one-hundred and twenty years.
- 1935 One thousand unemployed Canadian workers board freight cars in Vancouver, British Columbia, beginning a protest trek to Ottawa, Ontario.
- 1937 The Duke of Windsor marries Wallis Simpson.
- 1940 World War II: The Luftwaffe bombs Paris.
- 1940 World War II: The <u>Battle of Dunkirk</u> ends with a <u>German</u> victory and with <u>Allied</u> forces in full retreat.
- 1941 World War II: The Wehrmacht razes the Greek village of Kandanos to the ground, killing 180 of its inhabitants.
- 1942 World War II: <u>Japan</u> begins the <u>Aleutian Islands Campaign</u> by <u>bombing</u> Unalaska Island.
- <u>1943</u> In <u>Los Angeles</u>, <u>California</u>, white <u>U.S. Navy</u> sailors and <u>Marines</u> clash with Latino youths in the Zoot Suit Riots.

- 1963 The <u>Buddhist crisis</u>: Soldiers of the <u>Army of the Republic of Vietnam</u> attack protesting <u>Buddhists</u> in <u>Hué</u>, <u>South Vietnam</u>, with liquid chemicals from tear-gas grenades, causing 67 people to be hospitalised for blistering of the skin and respiratory ailments.
- 1965 The launch of <u>Gemini 4</u>, the first multi-day space mission by a <u>NASA</u> crew. Ed White, a crew member, performs the first American spacewalk.
- 1968 <u>Valerie Solanas</u>, the author of <u>SCUM Manifesto</u>, attempts to assassinate <u>Andy Warhol</u> by shooting him three times.
- 1969 Melbourne–Evans collision: off the coast of South Vietnam, the Australian aircraft carrier HMAS Melbourne cuts the U.S. Navy destroyer USS Frank E. Evans in half.
- 1979 A blowout at the <u>Ixtoc I</u> oil well in the southern <u>Gulf of Mexico</u> causes at least 3,000,000 barrels (480,000 m³) of oil to be spilled into the waters, the second-worst accidental oil spill ever recorded.
- 1980 The 1980 Grand Island tornado outbreak. Seven tornadoes hit Grand Island, Nebraska, which take five lives, 357 single-family homes, 33 mobile homes, 85 apartments, 49 businesses and cause \$300 million in damages all told, according to statistics compiled on the deadly storm by the National Weather Service and the American Red Cross.
- 1982 The <u>Israeli ambassador</u> to the <u>United Kingdom</u>, <u>Shlomo Argov</u>, is shot on a <u>London</u> street. He survives but is permanently paralyzed.
- <u>1984</u> <u>Operation Blue Star</u>, a military offensive, is launched by the <u>Indian</u> government at <u>Harmandir Sahib</u>, also known as the Golden Temple, the holiest shrine for the <u>Sikhs</u>, in <u>Amritsar</u>. The operation continues until <u>June 6</u>, with casualties, most of them civilians, in excess of 5,000.
- <u>1989</u> The government of <u>China</u> sends troops to force protesters out of <u>Tiananmen Square</u> after seven weeks of occupation.
- <u>1991</u> <u>Mount Unzen</u> erupts in <u>Kyūshū</u>, <u>Japan</u>, killing 43 people, all of them either researchers or journalists.
- 2006 The union of <u>Serbia and Montenegro</u> comes to an end with <u>Montenegro</u>'s formal declaration of independence.
