- <u>1831</u> The <u>Treaty of Dancing Rabbit Creek</u>, the first removal treaty in accordance with the <u>Indian Removal Act</u>, is proclaimed. The <u>Choctaws</u> in <u>Mississippi</u> cede land east of the river in exchange for payment and land in the <u>West</u>.

#### President Obama to Award Medal of Honor

On March 18<sup>th</sup>, 2014, President Barack Obama will award 24 Army veterans the Medal of Honor for conspicuous gallantry. These veterans will receive the Medal of Honor in recognition of their valor during major combat operations in World War II, the Korean War and the Vietnam War. Each of these Soldiers' bravery was previously recognized by award of the Distinguished Service Cross, the nation's second highest military award; that award will be upgraded to the Medal of Honor in recognition of their gallantry, intrepidity and heroism above and beyond the call of duty.

In 2002, Congress, through the Defense Authorization Act, called for a review of Jewish American and Hispanic American veteran war records from WWII, the Korean War and the Vietnam War, to ensure those deserving the Medal of Honor were not denied because of prejudice. During the review, records of several Soldiers of neither Jewish nor Hispanic descent were also found to display criteria worthy of the Medal of Honor. The 2002 Act was amended to allow these Soldiers to be honored with the upgrade - in addition to the Jewish and Hispanic American Soldiers.

The 24 recipients of the Medal of Honor follow below.

#### PERSONAL BACKGROUND

## The President will award the Medal of Honor to:

**Specialist Four Santiago J. Erevia** will receive the Medal of Honor for his courageous actions while serving as radio telephone operator in Company C, 1st Battalion (Airmobile), 501st Infantry, 101st Airborne Division (Airmobile) during search and clear mission near Tam Ky, Republic of Vietnam.

**Staff Sergeant Melvin Morris** will receive the Medal of Honor for his courageous actions while serving as Commander of a Strike Force drawn from Company D, 5th Special Forces Group (Airborne), 1st Special Forces, during combat operations against an armed enemy in the vicinity of Chi Lang, Republic of Vietnam on September 17, 1969.

**Sergeant First Class Jose Rodela** will receive the Medal of Honor for his courageous actions while serving as the company commander, Detachment B-36, Company A, 5th Special Forces Group (Airborne), 1st Special Forces during combat operations against an armed enemy in Phuoc Long Province, Republic of Vietnam on September 1, 1969.

The President will posthumously award the Medal of Honor to:

The following individuals distinguished themselves by acts of gallantry and intrepidity above and beyond the call of duty while serving during the Vietnam War

**Sergeant Candelario Garcia** will receive the Medal of Honor for his courageous actions while serving as an acting Team Leader for Company B, 1st Battalion, 2d Infantry, 1st Brigade, 1st Infantry Division during combat operations against an armed enemy in Lai Khe, Republic of Vietnam on December 8, 1968.

**Specialist Four Leonard L. Alvarado** will receive the Medal of Honor posthumously for his courageous actions while serving as a Rifleman with Company D, 2d Battalion, 12th Cavalry, 1st Cavalry Division (Airmobile) during combat operations against an armed enemy in Phuoc Long Province, Republic of Vietnam on August 12, 1969.

**Staff Sergeant Felix M. ## **Take Action!**

Issue Background: This week, the Senate will consider on the floor the bill S. 1982, the Comprehensive Veterans Health and Benefits and Military Retirement Pay Restoration Act of 2014, introduced by Senator Bernie Sanders (I-VT). This omnibus Veteran bill makes important improvements to health and benefit programs for Veterans by including a variety of provisions from approved Veteran bills marked up by members of the Senate Veterans' Affairs Committee (SVAC). This bill is the most recent version of S. 1950. Given the limited amount of Veteran legislation, passed last year, a comprehensive Veterans bill is needed. In addition, an amendment will be offered during debate which will provide Advanced Appropriations to the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). During the recent government shutdown while many VA offices and services were closed, VA hospitals and clinics were able to provide uninterrupted health care to Veterans. By contrast, the shutdown delayed, disrupted and suspended other critical services. Advance appropriations is not just for government shutdowns, but makes VA health care funding more sufficient, timely and predictable and can do the same for the rest of VA's programs, benefits and services. Advance appropriations mitigate disruptions caused by late budgets and Continuing Resolutions (CR's), which have occurred in 22 of the past 25 years.

Action Required: Contact your Senators and urge them to support S. 1982, the Comprehensive Veterans Health and Benefits and Military Retirement Pay Restoration Act of 2014, introduced by Senator Bernie Sanders (VT). Also, urge your Senators to support the Boozman-Begich Amendment to S. 1982, introduced by Senator John Boozman (R-AR) and Senator Mark Begich (D-AK), providing advance appropriations for vital Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) programs.

#### **Details (To Be Put Into Letter):**

The Senate will be considering legislative action on S. 1982 in the coming week. This bill, the latest form of S. 1950, contains provisions of S. 944 which includes language to amend Title 38, United States Code, to require courses of education, approved for purposes of the All-Volunteer Force Educational Assistance Program and Post-9/11 Educational Assistance, to charge Veterans tuition and fees at the in-State tuition rate. Additionally, there is a provision, based on S. 629, the Honor America's Guard and Reserve Retirees Act, to recognize twenty-plus year career service in the Reserve Components of the Armed Forces by honoring such Reservists with status as Veterans under law. Furthermore there are a number of other provisions in S.1982 addressing Veterans issues including provisions of S. 495, the Careers for Veterans Act, which would improve opportunities for Federal and State agencies to hire Veterans.

When S. 1982 is brought up on the Senate floor, an amendment will be offered by Senators Boozman and Begich which will provide advanced appropriations measures to cover mandatory accounts within the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). The Boozman-Begich amendment contains the substance of, S. 932, the Putting Veterans Funding First Act, which was previously approved by the Senate Committee on Veterans' Affairs. Adoption of the Boozman-Begich amendment would not result in any additional spending by the Federal government, there is no PAYGO "score" and no offsets would be required, since projected spending if the amendment were enacted exactly matches the Congressional Budget Office (CBO) baseline. Advance appropriations process not only helps the VA during government shutdowns, but makes VA health care funding more sufficient, timely and predictable every year. Adopting S. 1982 and the Boozman-Begich amendment are essential to fulfilling our promises to our nation's Veterans. By making legislative improvements to VA healthcare and benefits while ensuring sufficient, timely and predictable funding, S. 1982 and the Boozman-Begich amendment are crucial steps towards keeping such promises.

### HVAC to Examine VA Progress in Improving Accountability and Quality of Care

**WASHINGTON, D.C.**— On Wednesday, Feb. 26, 2014, at 10:00 a.m. in room 334 of the Cannon House Office Building, the Subcommittee on Health will hold an oversight hearing to review the Department of Veterans Affairs Veterans Health Administration's efforts to fix deficiencies in care previously identified by the subcommittee.

Over the past year, the subcommittee held oversight hearings on a litany of issues facing VHA, including VA physician staffing and productivity standards; the care and treatment available to veteran survivors of military sexual trauma; VA's skyrocketing narcotics prescription rate. Additionally, the subcommittee has hosted roundtable discussions regarding the impact department-wide procurement reform has had on access and quality of care for veteran patients as well as opportunities to improve patient care by optimizing VA's existing authority to bill and collect from third-party health insurance companies for nonservice-connected care provided to veterans.

This hearing will examine the progress VA has made in these areas, what steps department officials have taken to increase accountability within VHA and determine where additional subcommittee oversight is needed.
